Read TO Your Child

- Read the book to your child.
- Ask your child to predict what the story might be about based on the title and/or picture on the cover of the book.
- Talk about the story as you read to your child.
- Share your favorite parts.

Read BY Your Child

- You may need to read the book to your child first, or read along with him or her.
- Ask the questions: Does it sound right? Does it make sense? Does the beginning sound of the word match the word you think it is?
- It's all right to tell your child a word when he or she is "stuck" and unable to proceed.

Read WITH Your Child

- You may want to read the book to your child first, or read along with him or her.
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
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Before Reading

Ask Prediction Questions

Look at the title and picture on the cover and ask, "What do you think this story will be about?"

Establish Prior Knowledge

Based on the title and cover, ask your child questions about the subject. For example- when reading <u>Clifford's Birthday Party</u>, you could ask, "Have you ever gone to a birthday party? Tell me about it."

Discuss the Author

"Have you ever read another book by this author? Do you know anything about the author's work?"

During Reading

Ask More Prediction Questions

"What do you think will happen next? Why do you think the character did what he did?"

Confirm or Restate Prediction

"Was your prediction right? If not, what really happened?"

Ask Explicit Questions

(The answers are found in the story.) For example-"How many gifts did Clifford get? Who came to the party? What was one gift he received?"

Ask Implicit Questions

(The answers are not directly stated in the story, but rather implied.) For example- "How do you think Clifford felt when no one came to his party?"



Ask Summary Questions

"Can you retell the story?" For example, "What happened in the beginning, middle, and end?"

Ask Comprehension Questions

"Where did the story take place? Who was the main character? What was the main problem? How did it get resolved?"

Ask Imagery Questions

(Can be asked anytime) "Close your eyes and imagine that you are a character in the book, what do you see and what are you doing?"

Ask Fun Questions

"Who was your favorite character, and why? If you could rewrite the ending, how would you change it? If you could meet one of the characters, who would you choose and what would you say?"



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


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
